## INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC NEWS

Congratulations to the Anchor Bay High School 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Cadet Band, 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Symphonic Band, Concert Band, Symphonic Band, and Wind Ensemble. On Friday, March 3<sup>rd</sup> and Saturday, March 4<sup>th</sup>, the bands participated in the District 16 MSBOA Band Festival hosted here at Anchor Bay High School. The panel of four judges awarded the 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Cadet Band and 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Symphonic Band with a Second Division rating, while the Concert Band, the Symphonic Band, and the Wind Ensemble turned in straight First Division ratings. Of the 20 possible performance and sight-reading categories the Symphonic Band received A's in 19 of the 20 categories and the Wind Ensemble received an impressive 20 of 20 A's.

Also impressive was the parental and student support in hosting the festival at Anchor Bay High School. Over the two-day festival, over 100 parent and student volunteers helped put on the enormous event by running concessions, parking buses and cars, guiding bands, ushering people into the auditorium, working the back stage and loading dock area, and creating the signage necessary to mark areas of importance. The visitors and bands performing at the festival were impressed with our facility and the cordial nature of our community.

On Thursday, February 16<sup>th</sup>, and Friday, February 17<sup>th</sup>, The Anchor Bay High School Jazz Ensemble took part in the 33<sup>rd</sup> annual Phi Mu Alpha/Central Michigan University Jazz Weekend. The festival featured over 50 high school jazz bands and combos from around the state of Michigan.

As part of the group's overall outstanding performance, ABHS was recognized with the "Second Runner-Up Best Band" award in the Class AA division. Further recognition went to ABHS when the brass section of Brain Keck, Sarah Zelenak, Kelly Grossman, Taylor Stanton, Samantha Strassburg, Dani Kopson, Josh Burns, Jeanine Blom, Andrew Karasinski, and Paul Barnett received the "Second Runner-Up Best Section" award. This marks the 8<sup>th</sup> time in the past 9 years that Anchor Bay HS has received a major award at the Phi Mu Alpha/Central Michigan University Jazz Weekend.

In addition, there were five "Honorable Mention" awards handed out in the Jazz Combo Division. Anchor Bay HS took three of these awards. Award recipients included: Steve Krycia (Guitar), Dylan Campbell (Saxophone), and Sean Demers (Drums).

Congratulations to the 13 ABHS students selected to the MSBOA District 16 Honors Band. This honors band is made up of a select group of students from Macomb, Oakland, and St. Clair county high schools. The District 16 Honors Bands will perform a concert on Tuesday, April 4<sup>th</sup>, in the Fraser High School Auditorium, at 7:00 PM. 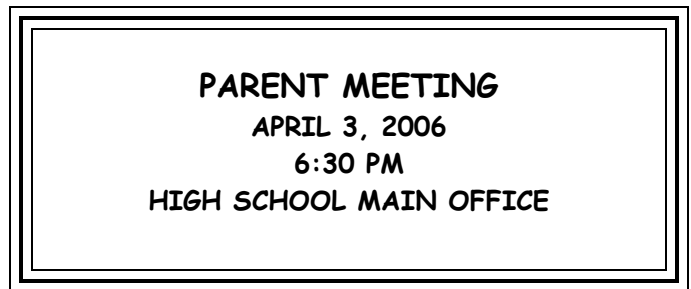

### CHOIR

Congratulations to the Anchor Bay Choirs who participated in District 16 MSVMA Choral Festival on March 14, 2006 at Macomb Community College. Concert Choir was awarded a Second Division rating in performance and sight reading. The Anchor Bay Chorale was awarded straight first division ratings from all 3 performance judges and the sight reading judge. ### STUDENTS SIGNING OUT

When a parent or guardian gives permission for their student to leave school for emergency or medical appointments, the following must be adhered to:

1. If parent/guardian is picking the student up, the parent needs to come into the main office and sign the student out. No exceptions.
2. Parent/guardian can call the main office and speak to a secretary. A secretary will then call the student out of class, sign him/her out and give the student a pass to leave if he/she has a vehicle at school.
3. Parents can write a note stating date, time, reason for student to be released, and a phone number where they can be reached. The note must be brought to the main office before school in the morning. The secretary will then call the parent to confirm the note and times indicated. **PARENTS WILL BE CALLED ON ALL NOTES.** If we are unable to contact the parent to confirm the note, the student will NOT be allowed to be released.

Once we have contacted parents and an excused pass has been written, it is the student responsibility to come to the

office to get the pass before he/she leaves the campus. If he/she leaves **without signing out in the office**, the absence will ***NOT be*** excused.

## ROTC NEWS

This drill meet is replacing the Air Force Nationals Drill Meet which was moved this year from Washington D.C. to Macon, GA. ## FINDING IT HARD TO TALK TO YOUR CHILD ABOUT SMOKING?

The key to finding out how your kids feel about the topic of smoking can be as simple as sitting them down, asking them good questions and listening carefully to their answers. But getting this conversation started is anything but easy.

As parents, we need to find ways to break down the uncomfortable barriers and address the issues candidly and honestly, discover ways to keep the topic in our communication, and explore inventive ways to help our kids say no. As our children grow, the need for this type of open communication remains constant. Kids change their minds all the time. That's why we, as parents, can't ever think we're

"home free." Influences from movies, television, advertising and friends constantly make it challenging for kids to say no to smoking. We need to find ways to open the door to communication, and keep it open so our children feel comfortable talking with us about peer pressure, feel confident asking tough questions, and are open to the idea of seeking our advice when it comes to saying no. Remember, in these conversations, it's important to speak from the heart, avoid being judgmental and lecture.

By establishing this type of open communication environment, we can be sure that our children will feel comfortable and confident talking with us and listening to the advice we have to share.

### PARKING PASSES

Parents please be reminded that if your student is driving to school, please make sure that he or she has a valid parking permit. Students are only allowed to park in the student lot and are not allowed to leave the building without signing out with the proper permission. Many students will lose their right to get a parking pass if they violate the closed campus rule, fail more than one class or receive an unsatisfactory citizenship on their report card for the third quarter. Also students must be debt free in order to obtain a pass. Violators can lose their privilege to park and/or may have their car towed. Also please stress the fact to your child that driving privileges in the fall of 2006 will be dependent on their fourth quarter of 2006 marking period grades, citizenship and attendance.

#### Transportation Information:

- All students must complete the Transportation Request form whether by indicating they are requesting or declining transportation services.
- Our department needs a form from each student indicating their transportation request for our records.
- All student bus stop assignments are determined by their home address. If your child will be picked up or dropped off at an alternate stop due to child care arrangements please note this information on the "Transportation Request Form" and fill out the "Alternate Bus Form". (Criteria for the Alternate Bus Stop are indicated on the form enclosed). Failure to fill out the Alternate Bus Form will have your student assigned to a bus stop in your neighborhood and may cause a delay in your student's transportation requirement.
