### THE PRINCIPAL FOCUS

Happy October! At the beginning of a new school year I like to share some tips for parents that may be used to assist you with your child's studies. This month I have an interesting idea that will teach your teen some 'mind mapping' to help with their studies.

Minds work like websites. From one main idea, our brains tend to branch off to other ideas. Those are linked to still other ideas.

A great way to learn something new is to create a link to something you already know. This is when a mind map can be useful.

Your child will need a pencil and paper for this exercise. They are to write down the most important word or short phrase of the subject to be learned in the center of the paper. Then Circle it. Around the circle, write other important words. Use overlapping circles or arrows to connect ideas. At this point your child should work quickly. Don't analyze. The goal is to get as many ideas down on paper as possible. Now edit. They might move some items close to related ideas. Color can also help to organize these ideas and make them more memorable. The child then can continue working outward, adding new information to what they already know. As the map expands, your child will get more and more specific. When it is finished, your teen will have their personal map of what is already known with what has been learned.

#### **Help your teen become more responsible this school year**

He forgot his homework, so he wants you to drive it to school. He hasn't completed his English paper-will you let him stay home from school until he finishes it? Sound familiar? Teens aren't always responsible. But some haven't ever had to be. Whenever those kids face a problem, their parents try to fix it.

That may solve some problems today. But it will **create even bigger problems in the future.**

Starting this year, you can help your teen develop the responsibility he'll need for the rest of his life. Here are some tips:

- Give your teen as much responsibility as you can. Teens need lots of growing room. Whenever you can give your teen a chance to make a decision for himself, do so.

- Help your teen think about consequences. Teens tend to jump in without thinking. Encourage your teen to think about the results of an action before taking it.
- Make a plan. At the beginning of the year, help your teen figure out a schedule. When is the best time to study? Can he play a sport and still hold a job?
- Let your teen learn from experience. Experience is a good teacher. But teens can't learn the lessons they need if their parents are always there to bail them out. If your teen doesn't get his paper written on time, let him deal with the teacher and suffer the consequences.

## STUDENTS SIGNING OUT

When a parent or guardian give permission for their student to leave school for emergency or medical appointment reasons they must do the following:

1. Parents call the main office and speak to a secretary. We will then write out an excused pass for the student to leave campus.
2. Parents can write a note stating date, time, reason for student to be released, and a phone number where you can be reached. Your student must then bring that note to the main office first thing in the morning. The secretary will then call the parent to confirm the note and times indicated. **PARENTS WILL BE CALLED ON ALL NOTES.** If we are unable to get a hold of the parent to confirm the note, your student will NOT be allowed to be released.

## ABHS CLOSED CAMPUS POLICY

We have a closed campus policy at Anchor Bay High School which means that students **MAY NOT LEAVE** school during lunch hour. Student may not exit the cafeteria during lunch without permission since classes are in session. Students may obtain permission to use the rest room during lunch period.

## CONSEQUENCES FOR TARDIES

There has been confusion recently over the Anchor Bay High School tardy system. It is a system that progressively disciplines students according to the number of tardies. For a first offense the student is verbally warned by the teacher, with the second tardy a postcard will be sent home as well. The third offense constitutes a detention assigned by the teacher, the 4<sup>th</sup> offense, 2 detentions. A student who commits 5 tardies will be referred to administration and will receive a one day out of school suspension. All subsequent tardies will be handled the same as the 5<sup>th</sup>. Tardies are counted for each class individually, and the count is restarted at the semester change, not quarter changes.

## JROTC HAPPENINGS

The logistics staff was working overtime to get over 120 cadets in uniform in the first couple of weeks of ROTC. Over seventy cadets went on their annual camping trip to Camp Covenant Hills where they tackled the low and high ropes courses. The low ropes course taught teamwork and problem-solving skills and the high ropes course increased self-confidence. The cadets enjoyed other fun activities like potato sack races and water activities including swimming, canoeing, kayaking, and 'The Blob' (a giant balloon sitting in the water where one person jumps and launches another person through the air and into the water). The parents once again challenged the winners of the cadet's volleyball game and once again defeated them soundly. The cadets vowed revenge at the next meeting.

The annual cadet trip to Washington D.C. has been cancelled for this year due to the relocation of the Air Force Nationals Drill Meet to Macon, GA. The drill meet and the cadets will return to Washington D.C. next year. The cadets are looking at alternative locations for their field trip.

**SCHOOL CLOSING**

If bad weather necessitates closing school, all the major local television and radio stations will be notified including channels 2, 4, 6, 7, 50 and AM 760. Cable TV channel 6 will also broadcast information about closings. The school district also has an emergency answering machine at 725-3544. Parents are asked to listen to the radio or TV and **not to call the school office**, since this will tie up phone lines that may be needed for other purposes.

**BUILDING SECURITY**

Student and staff safety is very important. In order to make the high school more secure, the hallway doors that lead outside will be locked at 7:30 a.m. each morning, 15 minutes after students arrive. Students will be able to leave the building, but those who arrive late or those who park in the back of the high school will need to walk around to the front. The main entrance of the building will be open. High school security staff will monitor the doors and hallways.

In addition, during lunches the north and south doors to the student parking lots will be locked. The students will be monitored by the Michigan State Police Trooper, Rick Sebring, and St. Clair County Sheriff, Haley Bonner to prevent students from leaving campus without permission. Anchor Bay High School has a closed lunch, and students are not permitted to leave unless they have a specific appointment and parent permission.
